The St. Mary Parish Council met on this date in Regular Session with Chair Kristi Prejeant Rink, M.D. presiding and the following members present: Craig A. Mathews, J Ina, Rodney Olander, Scott Ramsey, Leslie “Les” Rulf, Jr., James W. Bennett, Jr., Mark A. Duhon, Dean S. Adams, and Gwendolyn L. Hidalgo. Absent was Patrick J. Hebert.

The Invocation was pronounced by Rev. Mathews and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mr. Ina.

Legal Counsel Eric Duplantis introduced Assistant District Attorney Morgan Guillory Bodin, 16th Judicial District Attorney’s Office, Civil Department in the Franklin Office. He informed that Mrs. Bodin will eventually transition to replace him at the Parish Council’s Meetings. He stated that he will still be employed with the 16th Judicial District Attorney’s Office.

CEO Stephanie Guidry, Chairman Rev. Allen Randle, Vice Chairman Senator Bret Allain, and Board Member Mayor Eugene Foulcard of Hospital Service District No. 1 dba Franklin Foundation Hospital appeared before the Council to discuss the rebranding of Franklin Foundation Hospital. Ms. Guidry informed that five (5) names were suggested for rebranding based on geography, construction of the new wellness center, and the focus of overall wellness of the community. She stated that the name "Bayou Bend Health System" has been chosen. Parish President David Hanagriff congratulated everyone and stated that rebranding is necessary when so much has changed. In response to Mr. Olander's inquiry, Ms. Guidry stated that the five (5) names that were submitted for consideration were Bayou Bend Health System, Pelican Bend Health System, Bocage Central Health, Myette Health System, and Pelican Crossing System. She also stated that the legal name, Hospital Service District No. 1 will remain the same. However, the dba will change from Franklin Foundation Hospital to Bayou Bend Health System.

Senator R. L. “Bret” Allain, II appeared before the Council to provide an update on Capital Outlay Funding. He expounded on the American Rescue Plan Act Funds; rebranding name for Hospital Service District No. 1; State Surplus Funds with a proposed \$250,000 to St. Mary Parish Council on Aging; \$750,000 to Teche Action Clinic and funds to the City of Franklin to install historic lampposts along Northwest Boulevard to Highway 90; \$6.5 million to the Town of Baldwin and Water & Sewer Commission No. 4; \$1.5 million to Water & Sewer Commission No. 3; approximately \$4 million to City of Morgan City for water improvements; \$150 million project to repair and resurface Highway 90 from Lafayette to Morgan City that will occur over the next two (2) years; installation of a round-a-bout at the intersection of Northwest Boulevard and Chatsworth Road; funds to the Morgan City Harbor and Terminal District for use of dredges; construction of warehouse facilities at the Port of West St. Mary; \$250,000 for emergency power improvements to St. Mary Parish Courthouse; potential funding for the construction of a new fire station for Fire Protection District No. 11 in Four Corners; funding for walking paths in Bayou Vista; \$200,000 for Recreation District No. 3; \$375,000 for drainage culvert installation for Gravity Sub-Drainage District No. 1 of Gravity Drainage District No. 2 in Bayou Vista; reconstruction of Deslignes Road; \$500,000 for the installation of an additional pump at Bertrand Lantz Pump Station; additional funds for piping for the Town of Baldwin; continued improvements at Franklin’s City Hall; \$2.3 million for improvements to Cayce Street in Franklin; \$451,000 to improve water and gas meters in the City of Patterson; and a small allocation to Hospital Service District No. 1 to complete the Wellness Center.

Rev. Mathews reported on the Town of Baldwin meeting he recently attended and expounded on the importance of having the contract signed and replacing or repairing the broken water system in the Baldwin area. He encouraged Senator Allain to attend the upcoming meeting. Senator Allain stated that he fought hard to obtain \$6.5 million in Grant Funds and that Water Commission has until August 15, 2022 to submit its cooperative agreement. Senator Allain expounded on funding and the need for clean water for the citizens of Baldwin.

Dr. Rink requested to move up Item 14A, “Resolution congratulating Brenna Catherine Laubach as being crowned “National American Miss Louisiana Teen.”

National American Miss Louisiana Teen Brenna Catherine Laubach appeared before the Council to share her many accomplishments and to thank them for their support.

In response to Mr. Adams' inquiry, Mr. LaGrange stated that the bid price received for a new Caterpillar Bulldozer was \$675,000. He stated that the alternative is to lease it for \$11,560 per month, which includes maintenance.

- B. Trey Brazan, Attorney, Secretary of State, has written that in accordance with La. R.S. 18:653, I am enclosing a copy of the notice of resignation received from the Honorable

David K. Compton as Constable, Justice of the Peace Ward1, Parish of St. Mary, with an effective date of July 28, 2022.

Pursuant to La. R.S. 18:602, the governing authority shall within twenty (20) days from the date of the vacancy (on or before July 28, 2022):

- Make an appointment to fill the office.
- Call a special election. The next available election is March 25, 2023 and April 28, 2023, with qualifying dates of January 25, 26, & 27, 2023. However, in accordance with La. R.S. 18:602(2)(a), you have the option to choose the fall 2023 Gubernatorial election dates, which are currently scheduled for October 14, 2023 and November 18, 2023, with qualifying dates of August 8, 9, & 10, 2023.

Furthermore, in accordance with La. R.S. 18:1400.1(B)(2), if you choose the fall 2023 Gubernatorial election dates, the State will pick up more than 50% of the costs of ballots and election materials. In contract, if you choose the spring 2023 election dates, the governing authority will be responsible for all of their costs.

Per Mr. Adams' inquiry, Dr. Rink stated that the special election has not been scheduled. Mr. Ina stated that if the election is held in the fall, the State will pick up more than 50% of the costs of ballots and election materials.

Mr. Ina moved that the Special Election be held on November 18, 2022. Rev. Mathews seconded the motion, which carried by the following 10-0-0-1 Roll Call vote:

- C. Discussion and action pursuant to Ordinance No. 2152 which provides that any member of any Board of Commissioners appointed by the Parish who shall miss three (3) meetings in any twelve (12) month period of time without good cause stated to the Parish Council shall be terminated from the Board of Commissioners. The intent of the ordinance is to have people serving on these boards that have the time and willingness to attend meetings so as to ensure that a quorum would be met to conduct business that may come before the board. On June 29, 2022 a letter was sent to Mr. Robert Wilkerson informing him that a commissioner who misses three meetings within a twelve-month period without good cause shall be terminated. He was asked if he wanted to continue to serve and he phoned on July 6, 2022 informing me he hasn't been working nights now and would like to continue to serve.

After discussion, Mr. Ramsey moved to terminate Robert Wilkerson from Fire Protection District No. 7 Board of Commissioners. Mr. Adams seconded the motion, which carried by the following 10-0-0-1 Roll Call vote:

Dr. Rink stated that Mr. Robert Wilkerson will be sent a letter thanking him for his service and the vacancy will be advertised. Mr. Ramsey stated that absence issues need to be addressed early on and not a year later and he suggested that the current ordinance needs to be reviewed.

- D. Mr. Ina to request an allocation of \$1,800 from Wards 1, 2, 3, 4, 7, & 10 3/10% Sales Tax Fund to the City of Franklin for “Back to School Community Health and Wellness Fair.”

Mr. Ina informed that this event is free and that it will provide free school supplies, uniforms, and haircuts. He also stated that 1200 students benefited from this last year. Per Dr. Rink’s inquiry relative to the appropriate use of the 3/10% Sales Tax Fund, Mr. Duplantis stated that it has been done in the past but he would have to research it. Mr. Ina clarified that funds allocated will be used to offset operating costs for the use of the facility for the event; it will not be used to purchase school uniforms or supplies.
